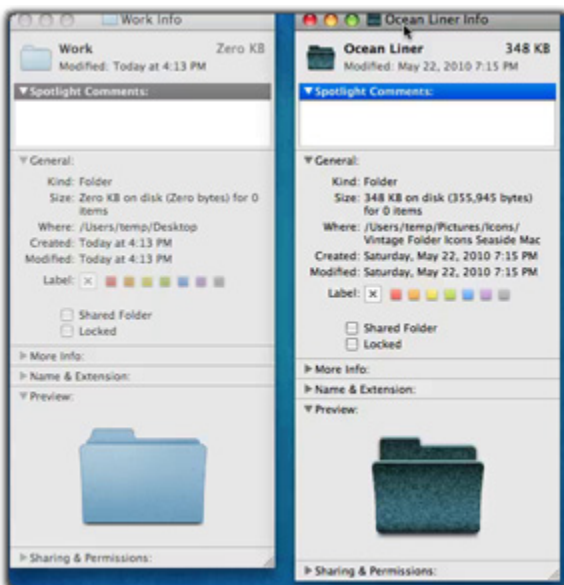
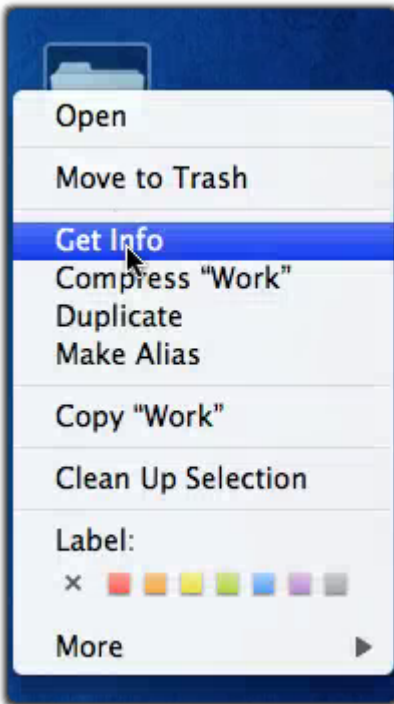


How to Change the Icons in Mac OS X

Here are methods for changing folder icons and the more difficult to change system icons.

To change a folder icon, follow these steps:

1. Right click on the icon you wish to change and choose Get Info.
2. Your selected folder's icon information panel will appear.
3. Locate the icon file you wish to use for your selected folder.
4. Right click on your substitute icon and choose Get Info.

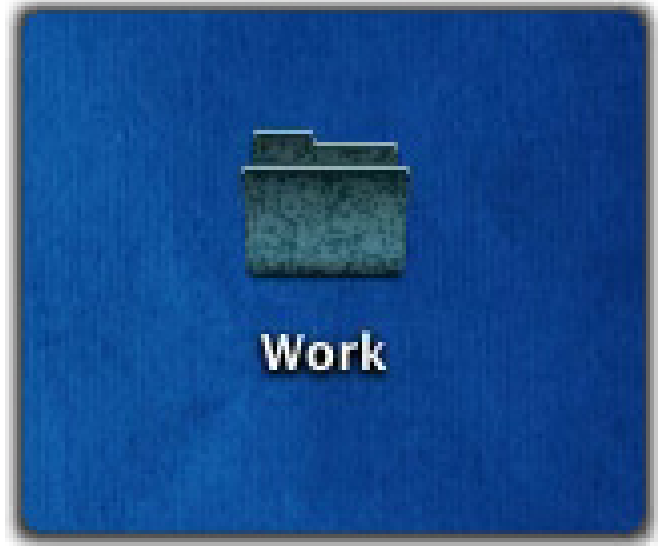


5. You will now see two information panels.

6. Click on the replacement icon in the top of it's information panel and press Command + C (⌘ + C).

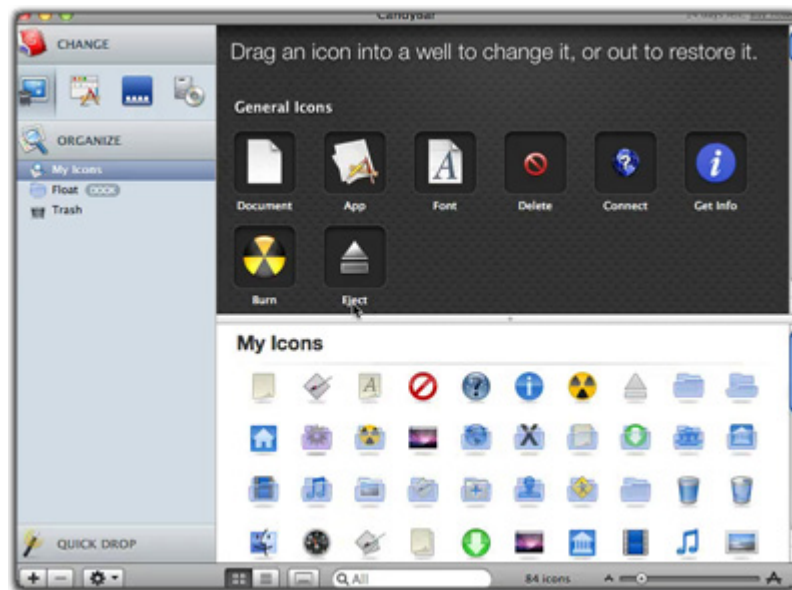
7. Click on the icon in the top of the information panel for the folder you wish to change and press Command +V (⌘ + V).

8. You may now close both information panels, your changes take effect immediately.



You can also change icons for many other system elements using a third party application such as CandyBar. To use CandyBar to alter other icons:

1. Download and install CandyBar, available as a free trial from <http://www.panic.com/candybar>

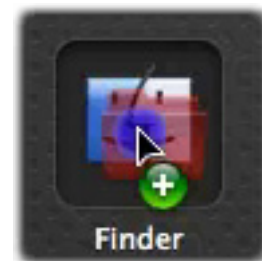


2. Launch CandyBar.

3. Import icons, iconcontainers, images or entire folders of icons to the CandyBar library by clicking File, then Import.

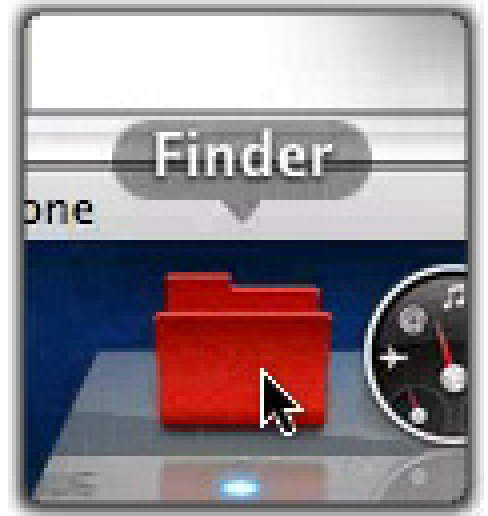
4. Locate the well for the icon for the application or system element in the list in the upper portion of the CandyBar window.

5. Locate the desired replacement icon in the list below and drag it to your chosen element's well above.



6. Click Apply Icons and authenticate with administrative credentials.

7. Follow any instructions for restarting or relaunching the Dock, Finder or system.



After appropriate restarts your changes will take effect.
